"God's divine power has given us everything we need for life and for godliness. This power was given to us through knowledge of the one who called us by his own glory and integrity. Through his glory and integrity he has given us his promises that are of the highest value. Through these promises you will share in the divine nature because you have escaped the corruption that sinful desires cause in the world." 2 Peter 1:3-4 NASB

1. Relationship: We enjoy privilege of prayer because of our relationship with Christ. Rom 8:15-17

You have not received a **spirit of slavery** leading to fear you have received a **spirit of adoption**, as sons by which we cry out, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God, if children, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ. Romans 8:15-17

- a. God loves to hear your voice. God can tell your voice from the voice of others!
- 2. God's will is in His Word "Your word, LORD, is eternal; it stands firm in the heavens." Ps 119:89 NIV
- 3. We pray according to the promises in God's Word.

Psalm 119: 1-2, 11, 89-90; 2 Tim 3:16, Heb 4:12, Matt. 7:7, Jam 4:2, Isa 55:10-11

4. "It is written..." - Jesus's example when tempted in the wilderness

Luke 4:4 " 'Man shall not live by bread alone.'" From Deut. 8:3

Luke 4:8 "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve." From Deut. 6:13

Luke 4:12 "It is said, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.'" From Deut. 6:16

5. Pray the Scriptures: God has obligated Himself to fulfill the promises in His Word!

Why "Pray the Bible"? from Matthew Henry's A Method for Prayer

- 1 Praying scripturally will **teach us what prayer is**, even while we do it.
- 2 It will **correct "shopping list" views of prayer,** which abound in the Christian community.
- 3 It will begin to solve in our own minds the question of "unanswered prayer."
- 4 It will **remind us of just how much there is to pray** about day by day.
- 5 It will teach us the extreme **urgency of prayer.**
- 6 It will return proportion to prayers long on petition, but short on adoration, confession, and thanksgiving.
- 7 It will instruct us **how best to pray for ministers,** missionaries, and one another.
- 8 It will show us the **proper way to approach** God in prayer.

- 9 It will remind us of the **good things that God does** for us [which we sometimes take for granted]
- 10 It will remind us to **always give thanks to God** [which is important for our assurance of God's faithfulness in answering prayer]
- 11 It will begin to engrave in our minds **biblical patterns of thought**, which can help immunize us from the enticing folly of the world's view of life.
- 12 It will force us **to rehearse the solemn warnings and precious promises** of God
- 13 It will move us from our **inherent mancenteredness in prayer to a biblical, Godcentered** way of praying.

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God-Centered Prayer vs Needs or Request-Based Prayer

1. Seeking God's face rather than seeking God's hand. Ps. 27:4, 8; Ps 105:4; 2 Cor 3:18, Heb 11:6

In order to have a right view of prayer, we must have a right view of God.

God-Centered prayer	Need or Request-Based prayer
Focuses on God, He is the only one worthy to receive glory, honor, and power. (Rev. 4:11)	Focuses on self or the current need. Can become self-centered or need-centered
Is something that all believers must do.	Can teach people that they only need to come to God when they have a need or request.
When we worship, we encounter God and He reveals our true need. We can then bring our true need to Him.	If we bring a need to God without encountering God first, we may miss God, not know our true need and/or not have our need met.

God-Centered vs Self-Centered Prayer Format			
Use scripture/testimony/music to focus on God's nature, desires, perspective, activity, purposes, attributes, intentions or promises.	Rather than allowing people's fears, needs, misconceptions, agendas, self-centered desires, personal ambition, distractions, etc. to prevail.
